Title: Text Amendment: Swap Meets								
SUMMARY RECOMMENDATION: Amend Yuma City Code, Title 7, Chapter 70 General Business Regulations, to update the licensing requirements for swap meets. (Community Development/Community Planning) (Jay Simonton)								

## REPORT:

A group of local artists recently inquired about the ability to operate several open to the public, pop-up markets throughout the year. Initially, staff looked at whether or not the proposed events could be classified as a street fair or a farmer's market. The proposed pop-up markets do not meet the definition of a street fair or a farmer's market. Street fairs, while also open to the public for the purchase of goods, are conducted on public streets; farmer's markets are primarily engaged in the sale of fresh fruits, vegetables, and other food products. Pop-up markets can take place on private property, and therefore do not meet the street fair criteria. Because the pop-up market does not primarily concern the retail sale of fruits, vegetables or other food products, a pop-up market could not be considered a farmer's market.

City staff turned to the zoning definition of a swap meet. It was then that staff discovered the discrepancy between the business and zoning regulations. Currently, according to the business regulations section of the code, a swap meet is defined as an operation composed of 100 or more stalls. Whereas, zoning regulations define swap meets as an operation composed of two or more stalls. Typically, a swap meet envisions a large number of vendors selling products to the general public; this is not always the case as is evident in the proposed pop-up market that is expected to feature 8-10 vendors.

In an effort to provide consistency throughout the City of Yuma Code, staff is recommending a modification to the business regulations in regards to swap meets. This modification will update the minimum number of stalls for a swap meet from 100 to two, which is consistent with the City of Yuma
