# CALL TO ORDER

**Protem Mayor Craft** called the City Council meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.

#### FINAL CALL

**Pro Tem Mayor Craft** made a final call for the submission of Speaker Request Forms from members of the audience.

## I. MOTION CONSENT AGENDA

<u>Item B.6. Cooperative Purchase Agreement: Park and Playground Equipment</u> – Authorize the purchase and delivery of playground equipment for the Pacific Avenue Athletic Complex by utilizing a cooperative purchase agreement originated by US Communities contract, for a total cost of \$105,157.35 to: GameTime, Fort Payne, Alabama (Bid#2017-20000147 Parks & Recreation) (Wendt/Wilson)

Miller declared a conflict of interest on Item B.6 and left the dais.

Wright asked if the playground equipment would be fenced in or open to the public at any time.

Wilson responded that she believed the park would be fenced and secured. Wendt confirmed the park would be enclosed within the complex. Wright questioned what time of day the playground would be available. Wendt stated that the playground would be available to the public during softball games Monday through Saturday and also during some games on Sundays as well as during tournaments.

Wright asked if the playground equipment would be mostly for children or if it would also include

exercise stations like Smucker Park. **Wendt** stated the equipment will be for children including hands-on equipment which will also be shaded.

**Motion** (Shelton/Wright) to approve Motion Consent Agenda item B.6. Voice vote: **approved** 4-0-1. **Miller** abstained due to conflict of interest.

Miller returned to the dais.

- O2017-001 Statutory Compliance Hearing/Amendment: Ordinance O2014-02, Desert Sky PUD Conduct a public hearing pursuant to A.R.S. §9-462.01 to determine compliance with the conditions of approval for rezoning Ordinance O2014-02, and introduce an ordinance to amend O2014-02 to extend the time to comply with the rezoning conditions. (DCD/Planning) (Lineberry)

Pro Tem Mayor Craft opened the public hearing at 5:41 p.m.

Linville explained that the original rezone for this subdivision was approved in 2014 through Ordinance O2014-02. Typically rezones are required to satisfy all of their conditions in two years and in this case the developer was unable to satisfy those conditions, which expired in 2016. Following the expiration, the developer and their agent came forward to discuss options as to how they could satisfy those conditions. She further explained that City staff reviewed those conditions and determined that a number of them could not be completed until their subdivision was approved by City Council, including the amenities for the subdivision. Staff has since removed those conditions and made them part of a development agreement, which was approved by City Council at the end of last year. City staff is asking that the original ordinance be amended to extend the timeframe from two years to the effective date of this ordinance, which would potentially be effective March 1, 2017 and approval of the rezone.

**Motion** (Miller/Shelton) to close the Public Hearing. Voice Vote: **approved** 5-0. The Public Hearing closed at 5:43 p.m.

## **Ordinance O2017-001**

An ordinance of the City Council of the City of Yuma Arizona, amending Ordinance O2014-02 to update the required right-of-way dedications, remove condition 9 of O2014-02 and to extend the time for compliance with conditions for the rezoning of certain properties from Agriculture (AG) District to the Low Density Residential/Planned Unit Development Overlay (R-1-6/PUD) District and the Medium Density Residential/Planned Unit Development Overlay (R-2/PUD) District, and amending the zoning map to conform thereto (To determine the compliance with the conditions of approval for rezoning Ordinance O2014-02 located at the northwest corner of 40<sup>th</sup> Street and Avenue 7 ½ E)
