

RESOLUTION NO. R2018-006

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF YUMA, ARIZONA, AMENDING AN INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT WITH THE STATE OF ARIZONA FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A PEDESTRIAN HYBRID BEACON NEAR THE INTERSECTION OF 8TH STREET AND 21ST AVENUE

WHEREAS, the City of Yuma (City) is empowered by Arizona Revised Statutes § 48-572 and Article III, Section 13 of the Yuma City Charter to enter into intergovernmental agreements; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 2016-014, the City entered into an Intergovernmental Agreement/Joint Partnership Agreement (IGA/JPA) with the State of Arizona (State) for the construction of a pedestrian hybrid beacon near the intersection of 8th Street and 21st Avenue (Project) to make the intersection safer for pedestrians to cross; and

WHEREAS, the original IGA/JPA denotes that the State will provide \$277,349.00 of federal-aid funds for the scoping, design and construction of the Project; however, bids for the Project came in higher than the State's estimate used in the original IGA/JPA; and

WHEREAS, the City has procured additional federal-aid funds through the Yuma Metropolitan Planning Organization (YMPO), which will result in the City contributing a local match of \$893.00 for the Project; and

WHEREAS, the proposed Amendment No. One to the IGA/JPA defines the adjusted Project costs and makes several other minor adjustments to the terms of the IGA/JPA that were deemed to be necessary by the State; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to enter into Amendment No. One to the IGA/JPA with the State.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Yuma as follows:

SECTION 1: Amendment No. One to the Intergovernmental Agreement/Joint Partnership Agreement between the State of Arizona and the City of Yuma is approved in the form attached as Exhibit A and incorporated into this Resolution by this reference.

SECTION 2: The City Administrator is authorized and directed to execute the attached Amendment No. One and take all steps necessary to carry out the purpose and intent of this Resolution.
