Grant Application: Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Program: Fiscal Year 2016 Local Solicitation

SUMMARY RECOMMENDATION:

Authorize the City Administrator to execute the required documents and submit an application for the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant Program: Fiscal Year 2016 Local Solicitation (CFDA # 16.738), offered by the U.S. Department of Justice, for funding in the amount of \$60,827.00.

REPORT:

The JAG Program is the primary provider of federal criminal justice funding to state and local jurisdictions. Under the terms of the grant solicitation, the City of Yuma (City), through the Yuma Police Department, is eligible to submit a grant application.

The City is seeking City Council permission to apply for \$60,827.00 in grant funding from the U.S. Department of Justice to help fund the cost of mobile data computing (MDC) activities. This technology allows authorized law enforcement personnel the ability to share public safety information between law enforcement agencies using a mobile device over a secured private network. If awarded, grant funds will be used to support the costs of MDC internet connectivity. The grant funds will be managed and disbursed by the Yuma Regional Communications System.

Should the City's application be selected for award, City staff will present a subsequent grant agreement and required documentation to City Council for review and approval prior to the acceptance of any grant funds. The lifecycle for the subsequent grant agreement is typically three years. It is anticipated that the awarded amount will be expended within the first year of the grant term. Additional funding can be requested in the 2nd and 3rd years of the grant term.

No matching funds are required at time of application submittal or at time of award.

Through a separate grant solicitation, additional funding may be offered by the U.S. Department of Justice. Should the City desire to act on this opportunity, City Council would be presented with a separate City Council action request.
