## REPORT:

The existing solution served over the past 20 years as a post-incident video security system to safeguard a variety of City assets including facilities, property and personnel. The system was not designed for its current use. Units were purchased individually and installed as new facilities were built. Additionally, the City found uncovered areas, and/or complete camera failures. As a result, the system is comprised of mismatched equipment, none of which is supported by the manufacturer. Today, video is streamed from the camera across the network to more than 20 different disk storage solutions that are equally outdated. This data streaming places a significant burden on our network infrastructure bandwidth.

The proposed solution will provide 204 new cameras, mounting equipment and five years of subscription services to the management software. Camera placement will not change, which allows for preservation of the cable infrastructure. The cameras accommodate video storage locally and for departments requiring additional capacity, the department can subscribe on demand as needed. User departments will have real-time access to the video using a web portal enabling complete self-service. This architecture eliminates the need for excessive on premise hardware and video streaming across the City network.

The purchase of 204 new cameras will be completed in two phases:

 Phase I –covered through this fiscal year budget: 169 cameras installed at the Police Department, Public Works, Utilities, City Hall, and Municipal Court facilities for a total of \$183,900.36.

•	Phase II – July 2020, pending budget approval: 35 cameras installed throughout Parks facilities for a total of \$37,778.33.
